Silica Exposure Training

Employers have a duty to protect their workers from silica dust exposure on construction projects. Studies have shown that many common construction work tasks involving the sanding, drilling, chipping, grinding, cutting, sawing, sweeping and blasting of concrete and concrete products are conducted without using proper dust controls to limit a worker's exposure to airborne silica concentrations. In many cases a workers exposure levels are far above the occupational exposure limits.

"Competent Inspector" certification

OSHA mandates periodic inspections of all Fall Protection Systems (fall harnesses, life-lines, etc.) by a "Competent Fall Protection Inspector." This training provides the knowledge required to conduct periodic testing of all fall protection equipment in accordance with 29 CFR 1926 Subpart M, 1926.500 - 1926.503, and ANSI A10.32-2004 and Z359-2007.

- Inspection theory for harnesses, lanyards, shock absorbers, carabiners, anchorage connectors and self retracting lifelines
- Equipment logs and recording the inspection
- Practical equipment inspections of faulty gear
